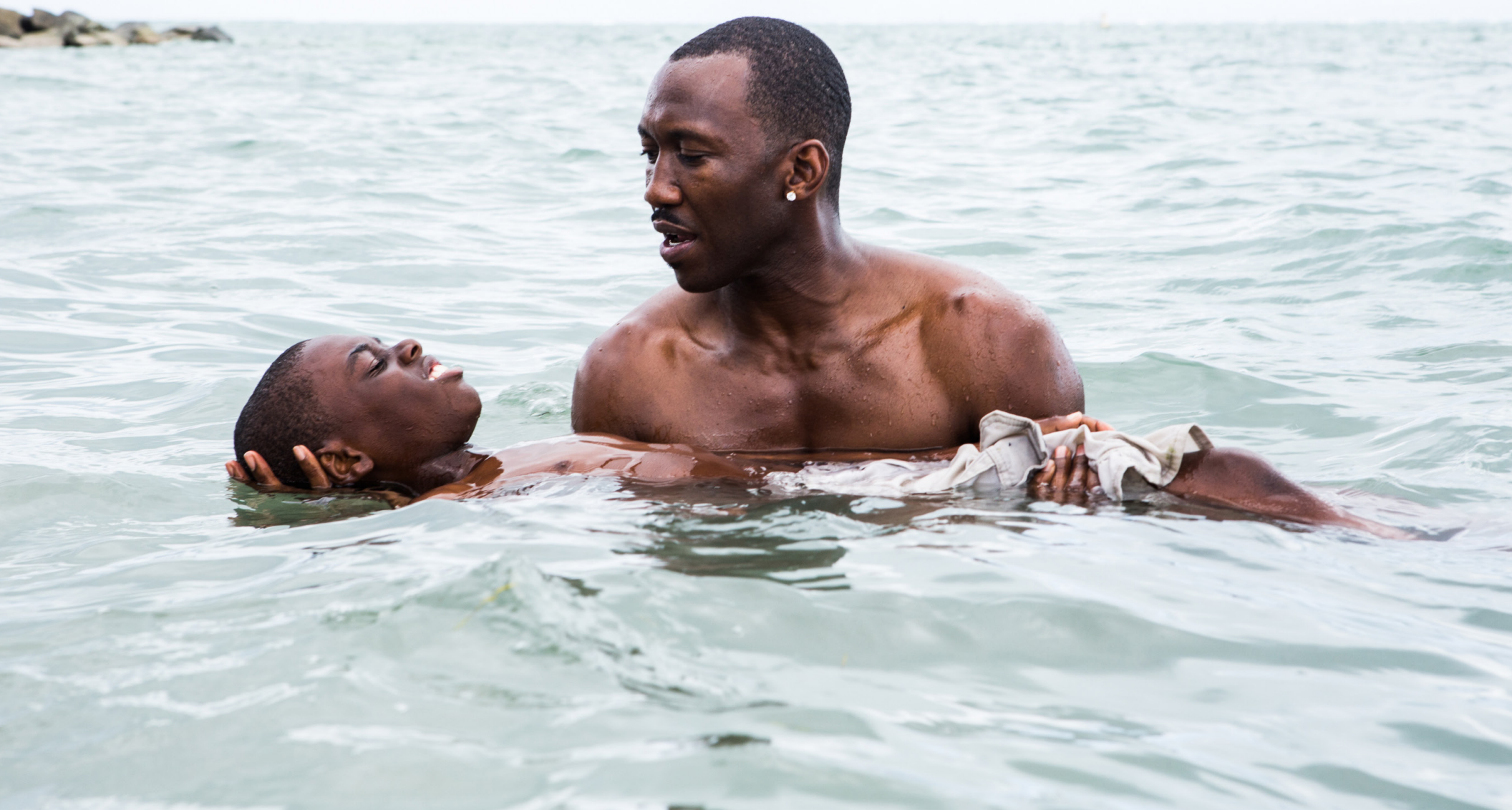

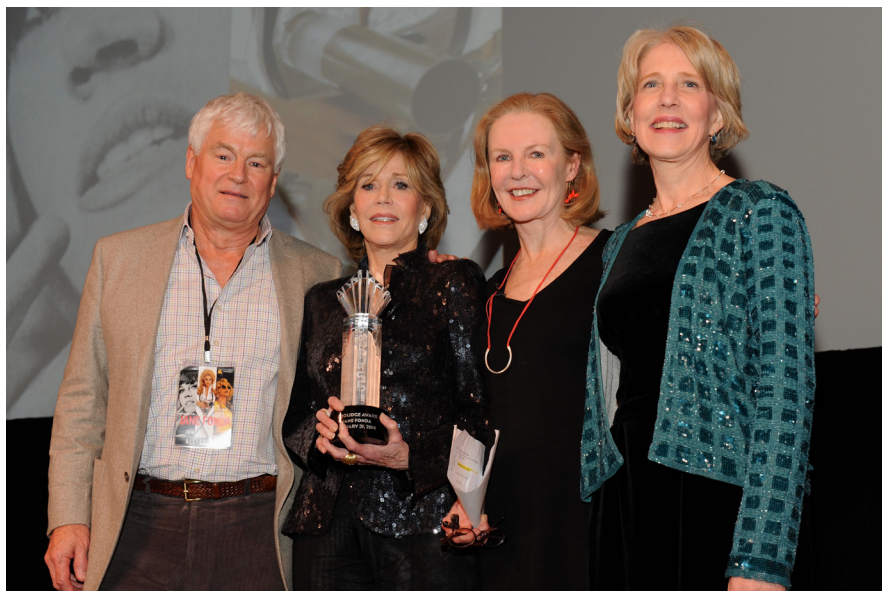

Benefit Screening of Marathon: The Patriots Day Bombing

The Coolidge hosted a special screening of *Marathon: The Patriots Day Bombing*, which featured filmmaker Ricki Stern in-person, as well as survivors of the 2013 Boston Marathon bombing. Proceeds from the event went to the One Fund Center at MGH.



25th Anniversary of the Alloy Orchestra

The Alloy Orchestra, which began at the Coolidge in 1991, returned to celebrate their 25th anniversary, with a live performance of their revised score for the German Expressionist classic *Metropolis*.

As part of our commitment to host live performances from a variety of exciting artists, the Coolidge presented a screening of the music documentary *Sound of Redemption: The Frank Morgan Story*. Following the screening, MC Eric Jackson, host of WGBH's *Eric in the Evening*, moderated a conversation with director NC Heikin and saxophonist (and Brookline native) Grace Kelly, which was followed by a performance by Kelly and bassist Bruce Gertz.

Coolidge Education

In the run-up to the presidential election, the Coolidge Breakfast Film Club presented six timely and exceptional films (including *A Face in the Crowd*, pictured below) on the subject of U.S. politics through the decades. The films focused on the question, "How did we get here?" Instructor Kaj Wilson, former artistic director of the Boston Jewish Film Festival and film editor at *The Improper Bostonian*, opened each screening with an eye-opening introduction, followed by a lively discussion.





National Evening of Science on Screen

As part of the National Evening of Science on Screen, the Coolidge presented Steven Soderbergh's disaster thriller *Contagion*. World-renowned geneticist and Harvard professor George Church discussed the transfer of pathogens from animals to humans, anti-science zealots, making animals intrinsically immune to viruses, monitoring our environment for emerging diseases, and why some of us are born immune.

Coolidge After Midnite Partners with The Trustees of Reservations

This highly immersive film-going experience, presented in partnership with The Trustees of Reservations, took place at Rocky Woods Reservation in Medfield. In May, iconic camp/slasher films *Friday the 13th Part III* in 3D and *Friday the 13th: The Final Chapter* were projected onto a giant screen set up right beside a pond eerily similar to the infamous Crystal Lake. In October, *The Evil Dead* was screened as part of our spooktacular Flicker' Treats series.

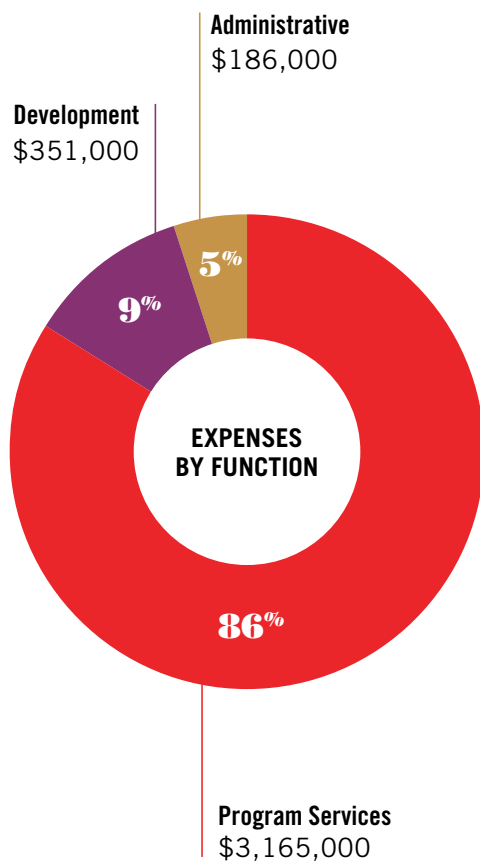
